

Double Jumper

You will be using your favorite button on the shoulder jumper pattern that is intended to be lined. It is your choice if you want to shorten the total length due to having a ruffle at the bottom.

- Cut out one front & back of the fabric that you want to be the “underneath” part (this would typically be consider the lining).
- Either cut a new pattern piece for the outer jumper, or fold your pattern piece up 4 1/2”. Cut out one front & one back.
- For lower ruffle (underneath jumper) cut two pieces 32” long by 4 ½” wide. And for outer jumper (the shorter one) cut two pieces 31” long by 4 ½” wide. Seam the ends together on each ruffle, press in half & run your gathering threads to each ruffle. NOTE: this length was based on using a size 3. If you are using a smaller or larger size, you *may* want to adjust accordingly.
- Stitch side seams of your outer jumper & your underneath jumper. Surge the seam to neaten.
- Sew the ruffles to the jumper sections matching the ruffle seams to the side seams of the jumpers. Surge the edges to neaten & press with iron, pressing seams up towards the jumper.
- Place a **right** side of jumper to a **wrong** side of jumper at the necks & armholes . Stitch all the way around. Trim corners & clip curves. Turn to right side out. You will now have both jumpers facing the correct way. Press the neck & armhole edges.
- Put your button holes & buttons. DONE!!
- If you want to add rick rack above your ruffle. You will need to leave one side seam of jumper & ruffle open. Sew your trim on jumper & then apply the ruffle. Sew the whole side seam & surge to neaten. Continue to put together as above.
